



Demolition Facility Recycling Plan Evaluation Criteria

To be eligible for 919 surcharge fee recycling plan credit, a facility should accumulate the minimum point values for each category of the plan. Recycling Plans must be submitted annually with license renewal applications and **must only contain information that directly applies to activities for this facility.** Facility will allow the St. Louis County Environmental Services Director or authorized representative access to the site for review of on-site recycling program practices.

- If County staff determine that the facility is not adhering to it's plan, the 25% surcharge credit will be suspended for a minimum period of one (1) month.
- Records of materials recycled or reused, including the volumes of materials and vendors or end markets should be kept on site and available for review on the request of the County.
- When the facility makes revisions to their recycling plan, other than specific markets for recovered materials, they must submit a revised plan to the County for review and approval.
