There was discussion regarding the liquor law violation at Ballz Deep, Inc. d/b/a The Other Place Bar and Grill, Rice Lake Township. Lt. Rolland said an 18 year old purchased a case of beer from a clerk who did not ask for identification. He said this was the first violation for the establishment.

At this time, Martin Hinz and Robert Hargraves appeared for Ballz Deep, Inc. d/b/a The Other Place Bar and Grill, Rice Lake Township, regarding a liquor law violation, sale to minor, which occurred on July 27, 2012. Chair Nelson asked the license holders to explain what happened and the steps taken to prevent it from happening again. Mr. Hargraves apologized to the Committee and said it was a case of mistaken identity. The bartender thought she recognized him from weekly attendance at volleyball games. Mr. Hinz said he talked to the bartender and told her that unless she is absolutely certain that a person is of age, she must ask for identification. He said that she is a good and valued employee, that she will be taking classes to prevent this from happening again, that she has learned a valuable lesson, and will not be making the mistake again. Mr. Hinz said that he and Mr. Hargraves take the matter very seriously and will take the necessary steps to prevent this from happening again. He said they put in a lot of effort to prevent violations from occurring, however they have not put in enough and they will be implementing additional training. In addition, he added the following:

1. A lot of time is spent with employees going over correct procedures on checking identification, etc.
2. Has posted newspaper articles about violations at other establishments
3. Has posted information on consequences
4. Additional signage has been placed in the bar and waitress area, including date calendars and driver's license examples

Commissioner Dahlberg asked why this bartender did not have the proper training. Mr. Hinz said employees that transferred from their prior owned liquor establishment, located in the City of Hermantown, to The Other Place Bar and Grill had had the proper training. This particular employee was kept on from the prior owners, and her lack of training slipped through the cracks. Chair Nelson said the committee treats all first time violations the same. Auditor Dicklich made a motion, supported by Commissioner Dahlberg, to recommend to the County Board, a ten (10) day suspension and \$1000.00 fine, nine (9) days and \$1000.00, stayed, if no same or similar violations occur within one year, subject to additional penalties that may be imposed by the County Board. A public hearing will be scheduled for October 9, 2012. Proposed suspension date is October 15, 2012. Chair Nelson said that Mr. Hinz and Mr. Hargraves may attend the public hearing if they wish to do so.

There was discussion regarding the liquor law violation at Silver Fox Lodge, Gnesen Township. Lt. Rolland said an 18 year old purchased two 12 packs of beer from a clerk who did not ask for identification. He said this was the first violation for the establishment.

At this time, Vernon and Kathy Skoglund appeared for Silver Fox Lodge, Gnesen Township, regarding a liquor law violation, sale to minor, which occurred on July 27, 2012. Chair Nelson asked the license holders to explain what happened and the steps taken to prevent it from happening again.

Mrs. Skoglund said they have been in business for 33 years and have never had any violations. She said the bartender, who was helping out, was experienced, but distracted due to personal problems. She was surprised that he didn't ask for identification, which was a stupid oversight. She wishes she had been bartending, because it wouldn't have happened. Mr. Skoglund apologized to the Committee. Mr. Skoglund said they check everybody's identification. Chair Nelson asked if the bartender was a casual employee. Mrs. Skoglund answered yes, and said they are open May 1 to October 1 and only open on weekends and the bartender was helping out. Chair Nelson said that the license holder is responsible even if the employee is contracted. He said he hopes they take the steps necessary to prevent this from happening again. He said the committee treats all first time violations the same. Commissioner Dahlberg made a motion, supported by Lt. Rolland, to recommend to the County Board, a ten (10) day suspension and \$1000.00 fine, nine (9) days and \$1000.00, stayed, if no same or similar violations occur within one year, subject to additional penalties that may be imposed by the County Board. A public hearing will be scheduled for October 9, 2012. Proposed suspension date is May 6, 2013, as the establishment is open seasonally from May 1 to October 1 of each year.





#### **RELATED DEPARTMENTAL GOAL:**

Financial return to the county and taxing districts.

#### **ACTION REQUESTED:**

The St. Louis County Board is requested to amend a private sale of state tax forfeited land authorized by County Board Resolution No. 12-371, dated June 26, 2012, to adjust the sale price.

#### **BACKGROUND:**

St. Louis County Board Resolution No. 12-371, dated June 26, 2012, authorized a private sale of state tax forfeited land to Michael Jershe for a land value of \$2,800 plus fees. Mr. Jershe contested the land value at a meeting of the County Board held in Ely on that date, and chose not to purchase the parcel at the price set by the County Board. Instead, Mr. Jershe requested to have the parcel appraised, with full knowledge that the sale price may change as a result of the appraisal, and that he would be responsible for the cost of the appraisal.

A Restricted Summary Appraisal was presented to St. Louis County for its exclusive use by a Certified Real Property Appraiser under contract with St. Louis County. The Certified Real Property Appraiser concluded that the fair market value of the subject property is \$4,000. The cost of the Restricted Summary Appraisal to St. Louis County was \$600.

#### **RECOMMENDATION:**

It is recommended that the St. Louis County Board amend County Board Resolution No. 12-371 to adjust the land value and associated fees for the private sale of state tax forfeited land to Michael Jershe.

**Amendment to Adjust the Sale Price of State Tax Forfeited Land to Michael Jershe**

RESOLVED FURTHER, that St. Louis County Board Resolution No. 12-371, dated June 26, 2012, be amended to add the following clause:



Bids were requested for a culvert replacement, reclaim and overlay, and aggregate base stabilization project in Embarrass, Babbitt and Waasa Townships. Bids were also requested for a bridge replacement project in Lakewood Township. 






St. Louis County 2012 Road & Bridge Construction




