Employment Status

Population 16 Years and Over in Labor Force (Labor Force Participation)



Overview

- In St. Louis County, 62.69% of the population was over 16 years of age and in the labor force. Nationally, this ranked as the 1,361st highest percent in the labor force of 3,142 U.S. counties and is lower than the national average of 63.9%.
- In Minnesota, St. Louis County's percent population over 16 years of age and in the labor force ranked 67th of 87 counties and is lower than the Minnesota average of 71.2%.
- Locally, of the five largest cities in St. Louis County, Hermantown had the highest percent population over 16 years of age in the labor force of 70.21%.




Mean Travel Time to Work



Mean Travel Time To Work (In Minutes)




Overview

- In St. Louis County, it took an average of 19.4 minutes to travel to work. Nationally, this ranked as the 2,351st highest mean travel time to work of 3,142 U.S. counties and is lower than the national average travel time of 25.5 minutes.
- In Minnesota, St. Louis County's mean travel time to work ranked 43rd of 87 counties and is lower than the Minnesota average travel time of 21.9 minutes.
- Locally, of the five largest cities in St. Louis County, Chisholm had the highest mean travel time to work of 19.6 minutes.

About the Data: Mean travel time to work is the average travel time in minutes that workers usually took to get from home to work (one way) for those 16 years old and over and who did not work at home. Travel time includes time spent waiting for public transportation, picking up passengers, and other time spent getting to work.



Percent of Total County Employment







Percent of Total County Employment





Percent of Total County Employment





Percent of Total County Employment









Percent of Total County Employment





Percent of Total County Employment




Wholesale Trade

Percent of Total County Employment





Percent of Total County Employment








Percent of Total County Employment

Overview

- In St. Louis County, the median household income is \$36,306. Nationally, this ranked as the 1,183rd highest median household income of 3,142 U.S. counties and is lower than the national median of \$41,994.
- In Minnesota, St. Louis County's median household income ranked 52nd of 87 counties and is lower than the Minnesota median of \$47,111.
- Locally, of the five largest cities in St. Louis County, Hermantown had the highest median household income of \$49,861.







Overview

- In St. Louis County, 12.05% of the population lived in poverty. Nationally, this ranked as the 1,796th highest poverty rate of 3,142 U.S. counties and is lower than the national average of 12.4%.
- In Minnesota, St. Louis County's percent population in poverty ranked 6th of 87 counties and is higher than the Minnesota average of 7.9%.
- Locally, of the five largest cities in St. Louis County, Virginia had the highest percent population in poverty of 15.85%.

About the Data: To determine a person's poverty status, one compares the person's total family income with poverty thresholds appropriate for that person's family size and composition. Individuals for whom poverty status is determined was for all people except institutionalized people, people in military group quarters, people in college dormitories, and unrelated individuals under 15 years old.
