


College or Graduate School Enrollment

As Percentage (%) of Total Population




Overview

- In St. Louis County, 8.3% of the population were enrolled in college or graduate school. Nationally, this ranked as the 231st highest percentage of 3,142 U.S. counties and is higher than the national average of 6.2%.
- In Minnesota, St. Louis County's percent population enrolled in college or graduate school ranked 10th of 87 counties and is higher than the Minnesota average of 6.0%.
- Locally, of the five largest cities in St. Louis County, Duluth had the highest percent population enrolled in college or graduate school of 13.45%.





Overview

- In St. Louis County, 21.9% of the population had a bachelor's degree or higher. Nationally, this ranked as the 570th highest percentage of 3,142 U.S. counties and is lower than the national average of 24.4%.
- In Minnesota, St. Louis County's percent population with a bachelor's degree or higher ranked 16th of 87 counties and is lower than the Minnesota average of 27.4%.
- Locally, of the five largest cities in St. Louis County, Duluth had the highest percent population with a bachelor's degree or higher of 28.2%.

About the Data: This data comes from educational attainment of residents. It is the highest degree or level of school completed. Educational attainment is of the population 25 years and over.





Percent Divorced and Separated







Percent of County Total Ancestries Reported




Norwegian

Percent of County Total Ancestries Reported





- Nationally, 10.9% of all citizens reported Irish as their ancestry. This is the second largest percentage reported.





Overview

- Comparing to national counties, St. Louis County had the 12th highest percentage of total county population reporting Finnish ancestry. In Minnesota, St. Louis County had the 2nd highest percentage of total county population reporting Finnish ancestry.
- Comparing to national counties, St. Louis County had the 24th highest percentage of total county population reporting Swedish ancestry. In Minnesota, St. Louis County had the 17th highest percentage of total county population reporting Swedish ancestry.
- Comparing to national counties, of St. Louis County's largest reported ancestry group German, it ranked as the 1,021th highest percentage of total county population. In Minnesota, St. Louis County ranked as the 83rd highest percentage of total county population.


Polish

Percent of County Total Ancestries Reported




