

Ash – Ash from a fireplace or wood-burning stove is high in potassium, and 13 essential nutrients your soil needs for good plant growth and very good for (trees, bushes, etc.) The best disposal is to sprinkle a ring around the plant you want to protect. You'll need to reapply the ash each time it rains. Wood ash can be disposed of in the garbage. Caution: Ash should be allowed to stand in a metal container away from any flammable material for at least 3 days before placing in any disposal location with other garbage. Check with your garbage hauler if you do not haul your own. If you self-haul your garbage, inform the attendant at the site that you have wood ash before bringing for disposal. Some sites will have you place your ashes in a can away from the garbage canisters.
