B-303, Transfer Fuel from Rear Tank to Front in CP Vehicle 602

During an equipment checkout with an evaluator on command post (CP) vehicle 602, perform a fuel transfer from the rear tank to the front. When finished, the front tank should read more than three-quarters full, with no spillage or overflow. Do you have any questions?

NOTES TO EVALUATOR:

This module may be completed by transferring a small amount of fuel. It cannot be completed by simulation, as the major deficiency in performance is overflow from not watching tank levels carefully.

Task	Go	No-Go
Performs transfer when front tank level reaches one-quarter full		
Checks fuel gauge readings on both tanks		
Turns on fuel transfer pump; green light comes on		
Never leaves vehicle unattended while transfer is in progress		
Shuts off pump when front tank level approaches full		
Tops off rear tank level with regular unleaded gas at county or commercial fuel station		
Notes number of gallons pumped into rear tank on Daily Report Sheet		
No overflow or spillage results from transfer process		

Critical Criteria

Check if Go; Circle if No-Go

- Must not run any equipment out of gas due to failure to transfer fuel
- Must monitor tank level gauges and never leave truck unattended
- Tops off rear tank at earliest opportunity
- No overflow or spillage results from the transfer
