OBJECTIVE

Given a snowmobile on its trailer, and a practical checkout with an evaluator, remove the snowmobile from the trailer, drive a short distance; then return and replace it on its trailer. If the machine is partnered with a rescue sled or another snowmobile, remove it from the trailer as well. Demonstrate how to connect a rescue sled to a snowmobile. When finished, both units should be correctly positioned and fastened down on the trailer. No injury to riders or damage to equipment, no loosening of the equipment on the trailer, and no discretionary overrides from the evaluator should occur during the completion of this module. *NOTE: During the summer months, the snowmobile fleet is stored in a remote warehouse. Completion of this module within the schedule of your syllabus may need to be pushed forward or backward to align with the winter months. See separate criteria list associated with this module.*

Assembles ramps or tilt beds as appropriate for trailer		
Removes all tie-downs, chains, etc. from equipment to be de-trailerred		
Starts and moves machine per V-304		
Assembles rescue sled (if equipped)		
Connects rescue sled to machine (if equipped)		
Maneuvers machine (and sled combination, if equipped) away from trailer; repositions for loading with no damage, injury, or discretionary overrides from evaluator		
Disconnects rescue sled (if equipped) and packages for loading		
Repositions machine(s) and sled (if equipped on trailer); shuts down machines		
Connects all tie-downs as appropriate for trailer and machines		
Secures all ramps and tilt beds as appropriate for trailer		
All accessory equipment secured		
Uses body mechanics to minimize risk of back injury		

Critical Criteria

Check if Go; Circle if No-Go

- Must assemble ramps or tilt beds to avoid coming loose or falling off while unloading
- Must drive machines down ramp without going off sides of ramps or tilt beds
- Rescue sled must be securely connected to machine to prevent loss while underway
- Must replace equipment on trailer without driving over side rails or ends of trailer bed
- Must secure all ramps, machines, sleds, and equipment, with no loosening or loss.
