

## **Phase 3: St. Louis County Small Business COVID-19 Relief Grants**

**PROGRAM GUIDELINES** 

**Purpose:** St. Louis County COVID-19 Business Relief Grants provide economic relief to eligible businesses and non-profits adversely affected by the COVID-19 pandemic.

Grant Amounts	Qualified businesses and non-profits with under 20 full and part-time employees shall be eligible to receive up to \$15,000;		
	2. Qualified businesses and non-profits with 20 or more full and part-time employees but less than 100 full-and part-time employees shall be eligible to receive up to \$25,000;		
	3. Qualified businesses and non-profits with 100 or more full and part-time employees but less than 300 full-and part-time employees shall be eligible to receive up to \$35,000; and		
	4. Qualified businesses and non-profits with 300 or more full and part-time employees shall be eligible to receive up to \$45,000.		
	Note: St. Louis County reserves the right to adjust grant amounts based upon the number of applications and demonstrated need.		
Funding Priorities	Funding will be prioritized based upon demonstrated need. Due to the anticipated high demand for grant assistance, not all applications will be funded.		
Match Funds Requirement	No matching funds are required. Grant funds must be paid back if eligibility requirements are not met or if proper documentation is not provided upon request.

	3. Payroll (Salaries/Wages)		
Eligible Businesses	Businesses and non-profits* must meet <u>all</u> of the following criteria to be eligible:		
	Must be physically located in St. Louis County, Minnesota; and		
	2. Must have no current tax liens on record with the Secretary of State at the time of application; and		
	3. Must have been impacted by a Minnesota Executive Order related to the COVID-19 pandemic.		
	*Non-profits that earn revenue similar to businesses, including but not limited to ticket sales and membership fees, are eligible to apply.		
	Certain businesses or non-profits are ineligible, including:		
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Ineligible Businesses	Certain businesses or non-profits are ineligible, including:  1. Businesses that primarily derive income from lobbying, gambling	or adult entertainment; and	



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## Application Documentation

- 1. A current completed and signed W-9 Form is required at the time of application in order for the application to be deemed complete. The current completed and signed W-9 Form must be attached to all online and email applications or included in all mail-in applications.
- 2. Applicants will not be required to provide documentation of eligible expenses at the time of application, however, they must do so upon request by St. Louis County and/or the State. Failure to submit required documentation upon request will nullify the grant and any or all grant funds received will need to be returned to St. Louis County within 30 days of notification.

Application Period	The application period will begin on January 19, 2021, at 9:00 a.m. and will remain open until February 3, 2021, at 4:30 p.m. No late applications will be accepted for any circumstance.		
Notification	All official grant notifications will be made through the mail and/or email to the contact information submitted to St. Louis County as part of the Phase 3 Small Business COVID-19 Relief Grant application.		
Disclaimer	Not all grant applications will be funded. St. Louis County reserves the right to revise these guidelines as needed to best address the impacts of the current COVID-19 pandemic. Further, St. Louis County reserves the sole right and discretion for program eligibility determination and final awarding of funds.
