CARES ACT

Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security (CARES) St. Louis County Public Participation Process Round 2

Rev. 1.0 (5-2021)

St. Louis County received special allocations of funds from the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) to address the current COVID-19 pandemic. As an entitlement entity for Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) and Emergency Solutions Grant (ESG) funding, St. Louis County has been notified of two rounds of Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security (CARES) Act funding awards totaling \$1,821,377 in CDBG-CV and \$1,527,412 in ESG-CV. The city of Duluth separately received CDBG-CV and ESG-CV funding.

Project eligibility for CDBG-CV and ESG-CV is the same as typical CDBG and ESG funding, but it must also assist with preventing, preparing for, and responding to COVID-19. The St. Louis County Board approved Round 1 funding recommendations for CDBG-CV and ESG-CV on July 28, 2020.

The CDBG Advisory Committee completed its review of Round 2 applications in the categories of affordable housing, human services, community facilities, public infrastructure improvements, and economic development. The County received eligible applications totaling \$758,148 and the available funding is \$879,196. The budget includes \$353,800 remaining from the Round 1 award process.

A CDBG Advisory Committee meeting was held on April 22, 2021, to review all applications and formulate a funding recommendation. The Advisory Committee recommended full funding for all applications and allocated the remaining funding of \$121,048 be held by the County for a future funding round. The public is provided an opportunity to comment during an abbreviated public review period May 17 – May 27, 2021.

ESG-CV Round 2 applications exceeded the available budget of \$853,754. The Rural Housing Coalition, Advisory Committee for the ESG Program, completed its application review and funding recommendation on May 6, 2021.

A summary of the 2021 CDBG CV and ESG-CV project applications with the Advisory Committee final recommendations is attached. The Advisory Committee recommendations and any public comments will be presented to the St. Louis County Board of Commissioners for its review and action at a public hearing on June 1, 2021. If approved, communities and agencies will then have until April 30, 2022, to complete projects.
