Musolf/Nelson moved that the St. Louis County Board authorizes the purchase of bulk material wall panels from Wieser Concrete, LLC of Saginaw, MN, for a total cost of \$431,280.00. [24-141]. Director Foldesi said he expects that the three new Public Works campuses will be completed in the next month or two. Director Foldesi commented that approximately \$70 million of projects will be completed by the county in 2024. The motion passed. (7-0)

ITEM: Request to Apply and Accept Funds from Sauer Foundation to Extend/Enter Into Contracts to Develop Family Resource Centers in St. Louis County

Background/Overview:

Community/Family Resource Centers are a national initiative for upstream prevention work supported by counties across Minnesota through MACSSA and AMC, and the State in the most recent legislative session. The collaborative work to identify needs, partners, form resource hubs, and community centers and develop a network of support is funded by these grant funds.

Across the country, Family Resource Centers (FRCs) work with families in a multi-generational, strengths-based, family-centered approach to enhance parenting skills, foster the healthy development and well-being of children, youth, and families, prevent child abuse, increase .school readiness, connect families to resources, develop parent and community leadership, engage males and fathers, support healthy marital and couples' relationships, and promote family economic success.

Resources available through Family Resource Centers range from basic needs (such as food pantries and utility assistance) to parenting classes, peer support, family development, leadership development, and more. FRCs meet families where they are, help them build on their strengths, and connect them to resources so that they can sustainably meet their needs.

Family Resource Centers emphasize community engagement, leadership, partnership, and the development of relationships between staff and families based on equality and respect. They can play an important role in supporting family well-being and in addressing challenges so families can thrive, particularly those issues that are poverty-driven and systemic in nature and can result in unnecessary contact with child protection.

St. Louis County received grant funds referenced in Board Resolution No. 22-519, Application for Family Resource Center Grant Funds from the Sauer Foundation, and Board Resolution No. 22-261, Enter into Contract with Consulting Perks, for the period of March 31- December 31, 2023. The Sauer Foundation made available additional funds with an extension through April 30, 2024. Public Health and Human Services used these funds to extend the contract with Consulting Perks through April 30, 2024 to complete the Needs Assessment phase. The Needs Assessment phase is near completion.

The Needs Assessment indicates that St. Louis County would benefit from the development of a county-level Community & Family Resource Center network and from strengthening preexisting models of Community and Family Resource Centers identified in subsequent regional sections, including culturally specific resource centers when available, and allocating specific resources to areas without current hubs since trust with pre-existing agencies is already evident and a workforce shortage is evident. The grant funds for the Development Phase will assist in next steps of continuing to work with our community stakeholders and other community members to build a Family Resource Center Network in St. Louis County. The Development Phase grant period is May 1, 2024, through April 30, 2025.

Policy Objectives:

Chapter 11 (Grant Management) of the St. Louis County Board Policy Manual requires specific financial and cost information be provided to the Board prior to applying for and/or accepting a grant. This is an opportunity for a grant-funding continuation that will support ongoing development work. Purchasing Rules allow for a contract extension.

Fiscal/Budget Impacts/Funding Source/FTE Considerations:

There is no direct budgetary or FTE impact as a result of the acceptance of the Sauer Foundation Grant in the amount of \$184,400.

Recommendation:

It is recommended that the St. Louis County Board authorize the Public Health and Human Services Department to apply and accept Development Phase grant funds in the amount of \$184,400 from the Sauer Foundation and extend/enter into contracts with community partners during the grant period of May 1, 2024, through April 30, 2025, to continue the development of Family Resource Centers in St. Louis County.

ITEM: Final Plat Approval of Otter Cove, Sections 25, 26, and 27, Township 53N, Range 15W (Unorganized Township)

Background/Overview:

Minnesota Power has leased parcels of land on Island Lake Reservoir for many years. The leased parcels are considered lots of record according to St. Louis County Zoning Ordinance 62, Article II, Section 2.7. Minnesota Power desires to formally plat the leased parcels and, in furtherance of this goal, has prepared and submitted a final plat application and map for the parcels.

The plat of Otter Cove consists of 43 lots and 7 outlots. All lots conform to lot of record standards of St. Louis County Zoning Ordinance 62 and Subdivision Ordinance 60. The final plat is also in accordance with the County Lease Lot of Record Subdivision Plat procedure and conforms with the platting and recording requirements set forth by St. Louis County Subdivision Ordinance 60 and Subsurface Sewage Treatment System Ordinance 61.

The applicant, pursuant to and in accordance with the County Lease Lot of Record Subdivision Plat procedure, has submitted the final prints complying with the requirements set forth by St. Louis County Subdivision Ordinance 60 and Subsurface Sewage Treatment System Ordinance 61. The County Surveyor has reviewed the plat. A copy of the official plat is attached.

Policy Objectives:

Administer St. Louis County Subdivision Ordinance 60 and Zoning Ordinance 62. Subdivision Ordinance 60 was amended in May 2022 to include a lease lot of record process. The Lease Lot of Record Subdivision Plat procedure is for parcels on federal, state, tax forfeit, or private lands that transition into private ownership.

Fiscal/Budget Impacts/Funding Source/FTE Considerations:

This action will have no funding impacts on St. Louis County.

ITEM: May Oral Timber Auction – Second Quarter 2024

Background/Overview:

By operational order from the natural resources commissioner, counties with land commissioners are authorized to sell timber on state tax forfeited lands according to provisions outlined in statute, without further approval from the state.

The Land and Minerals department regularly offers timber via public oral or sealed bid auction on a quarterly basis. The department has prepared timber appraisals on 28 tracts according to statute requirements and is ready to offer the tracts by oral timber auction in the second quarter of 2024. The draft of the May 9, 2024, Oral Timber Auction Book which is pending approval by the County Board can be found at:

https://www.stlouiscountymn.gov/departments-a-z/landminerals/sales-and-contracts/timber-sales.

St. Louis County timber auctions may include timber from non-tax forfeited lands under administration of the Land and Minerals department, such as county owned forest lands. The sale of timber from county managed forestland provides raw material for local industry, maintains and improves forest health and productivity, reduces the risk of wildfire severity, and provides financial return to the county and the taxing districts.

Policy Objectives:

Minn. Stat. § 282.04, Subd. 1(a), authorizes the county auditor, with terms and conditions set by the county board, to sell state tax forfeited timber upon any tract approved by the natural resources commissioner.

Fiscal/Budget Impacts/Funding Source/FTE Considerations:

Proceeds from the sale of timber are deposited into Fund 240, (Tax Forfeited Land Fund) or Fund 100-143001 (County Fee Fund), as appropriate to class of land.

Recommendation:

It is recommended that the St. Louis County Board approve the sale of timber on 28 tracts at the appraised price of \$1,588,252.21, via oral auction, as submitted by the Land Commissioner and according to state statute, with proceeds deposited into Fund 240, (Tax Forfeited Land Fund) or Fund 100-143001 (County Fee Fund), as appropriate to class of land.

BY COMMISSIONER

ITEM: Reclassification of State Tax-Forfeited Lands to Conservation

Background/Overview:

The parcels described in the attached list forfeited to the State of Minnesota for nonpayment of real estate taxes and were previously classified as nonconservation. The Land and Minerals Department has reviewed these parcels and has determined that they are suitable to be reclassified as conservation and retained by the State of Minnesota in trust for the taxing district for management purposes. Retaining these parcels will consolidate tax-forfeited ownership, protect mineral interests maintain and improve forest health and productivity and provide raw materials for local industry.

Policy Objectives:

Pursuant to Minn. Stat. § 282.01, subd.1, all parcels of land becoming the property of the State of Minnesota in Trust for the taxing districts through forfeiture for nonpayment of real estate taxes shall be classified as conservation or nonconservation.

Fiscal/Budget Impacts/Funding Source/FTE Considerations:

None.

Recommendation:

It is recommended that the St. Louis County Board classify certain lands owned by the State of Minnesota in trust for the taxing districts land as conservation.

Reclassification of State Tax-Forfeited Lands to Conservation

BY COMMISSIONER

WHEREAS, All parcels of land becoming the property of the State of Minnesota in trust for the taxing districts through forfeiture for nonpayment of real estate taxes shall be classified or reclassified as conservation or nonconservation as required by Minn. Stat. § 282.01, subd. 1; and

WHEREAS, The parcels described in County Board File No. ______ forfeited to the State of Minnesota for nonpayment of real estate taxes and were previously classified as nonconservation; and

WHEREAS, The goals of classification and reclassification are to encourage the most economical and efficient use of the property, reduce local and state government expenses, conserve and develop the state's natural resources, and encourage economic development; and

WHEREAS, The Land and Minerals Department has recommended that these parcels be reclassified as conservation after considering many factors including the present use of adjacent land, the productivity of the soil, the character of forest or other growth, the accessibility of lands to established roads, schools, and other public services, the suitability or desirability for particular uses and the suitability of the forest resources on the land for multiple use and sustained yield management; and

WHEREAS, The forfeited parcels may be located inside the boundaries of a municipality or town and Minn. Stat. § 282.01 requires that notice of the classification or reclassification of lands situated within a municipality or town must be transmitted to its governing body;

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, That the St. Louis County Board reclassifies the taxforfeited parcels described in County Board File No.______ as conservation, and a notice of the reclassification shall be transmitted by the Land and Minerals Department to the clerk of the municipality or town in which the parcels are located.

RESOLVED FURTHER, That the reclassification of the forfeited parcels will be deemed approved if the County Board does not receive notice of a municipality's or town's disapproval within 60 days of the date on which this resolution is delivered to the clerk of the municipality or town in which the parcel is located, or if the County Board receives affirmative notice from the municipality or town prior to the end of the 60 days of the date on which the resolution is delivered to the clerk.

ITEM: State Contract Purchase – Carahsoft Technology, Corp. (Next Chapter Technologies, Inc. – CaseWorks Software Solution) Phase 2: Economic Services & Supports

Background/Overview:

St. Louis County Public Health and Human Services has worked to "achieve the PHHS vision to provide an electronic document management system throughout the agency" (an excerpt from 2014 departmental planning documentation). In 2008 PHHS received a grant to pilot an electronic document management system in Ely. This work continued with 2011-2015 development of a regional solution for income maintenance and child support, followed by an internal document management solution for social services. These important steps have reaped significant benefits to our workforce in terms of efficiency, effectiveness, and accuracy. Technology has continued to evolve to a point where the department, together with the Information Technology (IT) Department, needed to re-evaluate options for continued growth towards this same initial stated vision.

PHHS and IT brought Phase I implementation of CaseWorks software through Next Chapter Technologies, Inc. (NCT) that brings all Social Services online, replacing the previous OnBase storage environment and adding DHS form implementation, built-in workflow, e-signatures, and a client portal with reporting and analytic capabilities (County Board Resolution No. 23-602). CaseWorks is currently used by 55 Minnesota counties and has proven that their solutions allow counties to realize economies of scale by efficiently leveraging State data and forms. This implementation is complete, training is underway, and a go-live date is April 9, 2024.

Phase II Economic Services and Supports (Financial Assistance and Child Support) solution is ready for implementation. Following County Board approval, a notification to terminate the existing St. Louis County-hosted Regional Electronic Document Management Solutions, supported by IT, will be provided effective January 1, 2025.

An addition to Phase I is included in this request and bid, due to the requirement for contracted case management providers serving St. Louis County Home & Community Base Services require licenses.

PHHS, with the assistance of IT and Purchasing Division, has obtained a competitive proposal (State of Minnesota Contract 128340 / NASPO Agreement AR2472) from Carahsoft Technology, Corp. - Reston, Virginia, the distributor of Next Chapter Technology, Inc. (NCT). This proposed agreement includes a 5-year term commencing January 1, 2024 through December 31, 2028. Following the initial agreement, the Subscription Term will automatically

renew for subsequent twelve-month terms, unless the county notifies Carahsoft of its intent not to renew in writing at least sixty (60) days prior to the end of the Subscription Term.

Policy Objectives:

St. Louis County Purchasing Rules and Regulations allow for Cooperative Purchasing at the discretion of the Purchasing Director, with approval by the County Board if required. (Minn. Stat. § 471.345 Subd 15(b)) These contracts are not subject to the solicitation process; however, they must follow all other contract requirements. Further, this agreement includes provisions allowing automatic renewal, making it evergreen. These contracts have the benefit of allowing suppliers and agencies to establish longer-term working relationships. All evergreen contracts require Board approval.

Fiscal/Budget Impacts/Funding Source/FTE Considerations:

The initial cost of the NCT CaseWorks software solution will be \$940,538.19. This includes an annual software subscription and hosting cost of \$394,176.99, an initial implementation cost of \$380,304, and a data migration cost of \$24,000. It is estimated that 53.5% of the ESS costs will be reimbursed through State and Federal cost allocation plans. Resulting in a net expense to the department of \$341,376.54 in year 1, and \$149,003.93 annually in years 2 and 3. Additionally, there will be a cost savings of approximately \$115,151 annually for current IT support and OnBase licenses in ESS. The remainder of year 1 costs, \$142,057.20, is for contracted case managers, at 40% reimbursement, net is \$85,234 in year one and subsequent years. See the table below:

One time funding for the 2024 expenses for implementation and year 1 maintenance is available from an additional, unexpected Social Service Time Study (SSTS) credit from DHS for a change in a calculation. These funds were also utilized for Phase I and encumbered for Phase II. The remainder of the year 1 expense is funded by the PHHS Technology fund balance. The proposal cost presented by Carahsoft Technology, Corp. under the first 5-year term includes professional services and the required software licensing subscription for a total cost not to exceed \$3,167,250.68.

WHEREAS, In a State Supervised County Administered government for Social Services, Minnesota DHS/MNIT provides the major systems (MAXIS, METS, MMIS, MEC², PRISM, SSIS, MnCHOICES, SMI) that county workers use every day to deliver services to residents; mission-critical systems capture data, automate complex program policies, and provide functionality to support human services administration; and

WHEREAS, Many of these systems are aging (e.g., MAXIS, SSIS, PRISM and SMI are 20+ years old) and have not been fully modernized while some are newer (e.g., METS, MnCHOICES, MEC²) but lack basic functionality needed to meet user need; and

WHEREAS, Minnesota counties also invest heavily in technologies that support, extend, and fills gaps in and around state systems; and Counties achieve maximum functionality including interfaces with DHS systems and implementation of DHS live forms when banding together to leverage access; and

WHEREAS, Since 2008 NCT CaseWorks has been the primary social service system provider in Minnesota and in 2024 over 55 counties utilize CaseWorks for Social Service and Economic Assistance programming; and

WHEREAS, One-time funds are available for implementation and ongoing maintenance costs will be moderated by increased reimbursement and reductions in Information Technology (IT) programming expenses as well as the cost avoidance for future IT needs in St. Louis County.

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, That the St. Louis County board authorizes the Information Technology Department, with use of State of Minnesota Contract 128340 / NASPO Agreement AR2472, to purchase implementation services, CaseWorks software subscription, and ongoing maintenance from Carahsoft Technology, Corp. - Reston, Virginia, the distributor of Next Chapter Technology, Inc. ITEM: St. Louis County Phone System Upgrade

Background/Overview:

The existing ShoreTel phone system has been in use at the county for over 15 years, and in that time, a lot has changed in terms of how employees need to interact with a phone system. The COVID-19 pandemic of 2020 necessitated that St. Louis County migrate workers to mobile work locations. That shift, and the ongoing use of mobile work in the county, underscores the need to increase the capabilities of the county's phone system to meet the needs of in-office and mobile workers, to provide for more integrated collaboration features, and to maintain a more current and supported platform. The result is a need to migrate to a new phone system.

In response to this need, the Information Technology (IT) Department formed a phone system replacement selection committee which received demonstrations of phone providers on a recognized county agreement. This committee outlined critical requirements for a new phone system, attended demos of several potential phone system replacement options, and collectively chose a new phone system. The next generation of phone system needs to provide mobility features including stable software-based calling, integration with collaboration and video conferencing platforms, transcription, real-time call center monitoring, text to voice capabilities, recording of voice signatures, and real-time dashboarding and reporting capabilities.

The IT Steering Committee reviewed the recommendations of the selection committee at its meeting on March 11, 2024. The IT Steering Committee unanimously recommended forwarding the Mitel MyVoice Business phone system, sold by Black Box of Lawrence, PA, proposal for the County Board's consideration.

This recommendation would be for the purchase of the hardware, software, and services required to implement a new phone system. The recommendation to proceed with the Mitel MyVoice Business phone system was made based on several factors including:

- Greater Feature Control
- Improved reporting/dashboarding
- Compliance (Security & Retention)
- Reliable Vendor Support Partner
- On-Premises
- High Availability
- Predictable Cost Structure
- Lower Cost of Ownership
- Vendor Guarantee
- Usability (Flexible Feature Set)

Policy Objectives:

St. Louis County Purchasing Rules and Regulations allow for Cooperative Purchasing at the discretion of the Purchasing Director, with approval by the County Board if required. (Minn. Stat. § 471.345 Subd 15(b)) These contracts are not subject to the solicitation process; however, they must follow all other contract requirements.

ITEM: Rainy Headwaters - Vermilion Comprehensive Watershed Management Plan Work Plan and Budget

Background/Overview:

On February 20, 2024, by County Board Resolution No. 24-111, the St. Louis County Board of Commissioners approved the adoption of the Rainy Headwaters - Vermilion Comprehensive Watershed Management Plan (Plan) to serve as a substitute for the Soil and Water Conservation District's (SWCD) comprehensive plan and/or the St. Louis County Comprehensive Water Management Plan. It is anticipated that on April 24, 2024, the Minnesota Board of Water and Soil Resources (BSWR) will review and approve the Plan.

This Plan is effective for a ten-year period until 2034. The Rainy Headwaters - Vermilion Watershed Policy Committee has approved an implementation Work Plan and the first biennium FY24-25 budget (Budget). It is further required that each of the six active partners and their governing bodies approve the adoption of the Work Plan and Budget.

The parties to the Memorandum of Agreement (MOA) have a common interest and statutory authority to prepare, adopt, amend as appropriate and/or needed, and assure implementation of the Plan for the Rainy Headwaters - Vermilion Watershed to conserve soil and water resources through the implementation of practices, programs and regulatory controls that effectively control or prevent erosion sedimentation, siltation and related pollution in order to preserve natural resources; ensure continued soil productivity; protect water quality; reduce damage caused by floods; preserve wildlife; protect the tax base; and protect public lands and waters.

Policy Objectives:

Pursuant to Minnesota Statutes Chapter 103B to 103C, all policy committee members and participating LGUs must adopt the work plan and budget to carry out the Plan's planning, development, and implementation.

Fiscal/Budget Impacts/Funding Source/FTE Considerations:

For the first biennium (2024-2025) the Rainy Headwaters - Vermilion Watershed Plan Partnership will receive \$1,004,508.00 in Watershed Based Implementation Funding from BSWR. See Table 1 below as approved and recommended by the Policy Committee on March 1, 2024. There are no fiscal impacts on St. Louis County for this action at this time. St. Louis County may receive funding from the implementation budget for the replacement of failing septic systems.
