The Board of County Commissioners of the County of St. Louis, Minnesota, met this 1st day of March 2022, at 9:32 a.m., at the Duluth Government Services Center, Duluth, Minnesota, with the following members present: Commissioners Patrick Boyle, Ashley Grimm, Keith Musolf, Keith Nelson, Mike Jugovich and Chair Paul McDonald - 6. WHEREAS, SCORE funds are derived from the Solid Waste Management Tax (SWMT) on

solid waste services; and

WHEREAS, A substantial portion of SCORE funding is now diverted annually toward other environmental initiatives and the State's general fund, which was not the original intent of the Legislature; and

WHEREAS, Less than 25% of total SWMT collections were awarded as SCORE grants to counties for recycling and solid waste management programs; and

WHEREAS, The Clay County Board of Commissioners recently passed Resolution No. 2021-56 which supports directing 100% of SWMT revenue to SCORE to fund county efforts to increase recycling, expand local markets for recyclable materials, and reduce landfilling; and

WHEREAS, Clay County is requesting other counties consider the passage of similar resolutions to be sent to Clay County for distribution to state legislators; and

WHEREAS, This action is consistent with policy positions of the Association of Minnesota Counties, the Minnesota Inter-County Association, and the Minnesota Solid Waste Administrators Association.

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, That the St. Louis County Board affirms its support for Clay County Board Resolution No. 2021-56 requesting the state legislature to appropriate all Solid Waste Management Tax revenue to increased SCORE grants to counties.
