The St. Louis County Housing and Redevelopment Authority (HRA) meeting was called to order at 10:46 a.m., at the City of Leonidas City Hall, Eveleth, Minnesota, with the following members present: Commissioners Annie Harala, Patrick Boyle, Ashley Grimm, Paul McDonald, Keith Musolf, Mike Jugovich and Chair Keith Nelson - 7 Absent: None - 0.

Commissioner Harala, supported by Commissioner Boyle, moved to approve the minutes from the September 12, 2023 HRA meeting. The motion passed; seven yeas, zero nays.

Commissioner McDonald, supported by Commissioner Harala, moved that the St. Louis County Housing and Redevelopment Authority (HRA) Board approves applying to Minnesota Housing for the 2024 Minnesota City Participation Program (MCPP) and authorizes the Interim Executive Director to submit the application. Upon acceptance of the application by the Minnesota Housing Finance Agency, the HRA Board authorizes the Interim Executive Director and a representative of the County Attorney to execute all the necessary documents related thereto. The motion passed; seven yeas, zero nays. HRA Resolution No. 23-04

Commissioner Jugovich exited the meeting at 10:50 a.m.

Commissioner McDonald, supported by Commissioner Harala, moved that the St. Louis County Housing and Redevelopment Authority (HRA) Board determines that the funding request from the Vermilion Housing Corporation will improve affordable housing and authorizes the Interim Executive Director and County Attorney to negotiate a \$7,500 grant funding agreement; and further, that the appropriate HRA officials and a representative of the County Attorney are authorized to execute the grant funding agreement on behalf of the St. Louis County HRA, along with all the necessary documents related thereto. Funds as needed are to be transferred from the HRA fund balance and be paid from HRA Fund 250, Agency 251001, or its appropriate fund. Tim Tomsich, of the Vermilion Housing Corporation, discussed issues the Vermilion Housing Corporation has had filling empty units due to building deterioration and the age of the units. The motion passed; six yeas, zero nays, one absent (Jugovich). HRA Resolution No. 23-05

Commissioner McDonald, supported by Commissioner Harala, moved that the St. Louis County Housing and Redevelopment Authority (HRA) Board determines that the funding request from the City of Cook will improve housing needs and authorizes the Interim Executive Director and County Attorney to negotiate an \$8,750 one-time grant funding agreement contingent upon receipt of authorizing resolutions by the Cook HRA Board of Commissioners; and further, that the appropriate HRA officials and a representative of the County Attorney are authorized to execute the grant funding agreement on behalf of the St. Louis County HRA, along with all the necessary documents related thereto. Funds as needed are to be transferred from the HRA fund balance and be paid from HRA Fund 250, Agency 251001, or its appropriate fund. Elizabeth Storm, Cook City Councilor, said \$8,750 is needed for the study and the total project is \$35,000. Liza Root, Cook City Councilor, said the last housing needs assessment was done in 1995. ITEM: City of Floodwood – Extension of Water Infrastructure

Background/Overview:

In 2019, the City of Floodwood (City), in partnership with the St. Louis County Housing and Redevelopment Authority (HRA), conducted a housing study. The housing study recommended the City develop 22 new rental units and to develop lots for new construction of single-family homes. The City indicated that it is experiencing a housing shortage and recognizes the need for additional housing.

The City has been in communication with a developer who owns land along County Road 8 and is interested in developing five single-family homes on the site. The land currently has sewer infrastructure adjacent to the property, but no water infrastructure. The City proposes to extend water infrastructure along County Road 8 to Popular Street to enable and encourage housing growth within the City. The City has worked with Short Elliott Hendrickson, Inc. (SEH) on developing engineered cost estimates for the project. The total estimated cost to extend the water infrastructure is \$171,650. The City has already paid for the design and inspections of the project. If the project is funded, construction would begin in the spring of 2024.

The City is requesting a \$150,000 one-time grant to fund a portion of the extension of water infrastructure for the new housing development from the St. Louis County HRA. The City will cover any costs over the \$150,000 required to bring water services to these lots.

Policy Objectives:

To administer and fund this project under Minn. Stat. §469.012, Subd. 1d.

Fiscal/Budget Impacts/Funding Source/FTE Considerations:

The current fund balance of the St. Louis County HRA is \$602,529.61. If awarded, the balance would be \$452,529.61.

Recommendation:

It is recommended that the HRA Board award a one-time grant of \$150,000 to assist in the completion of the City's water infrastructure extension for a new housing development and authorizes the appropriate HRA and County officials to execute the funding agreement and documents related thereto.




