## A few updates for you this week:

- The Minnesota Department of Health (MDH) continues to provide a daily situational summary
  on the number of confirmed cases by county in the state. The MDH website is updated each
  day at 11 a.m. As of the day I'm writing this, we have five confirmed cases in St. Louis County.
- St. Louis County Public Health continues to ramp up efforts. We are using additional staff and resources from other divisions/departments to help as we improve contingency plans and responses to this ever changing situation.
- We launched an <u>online resource guide</u>, covering a range of services people may need during
  these challenging times. Please check it out and share with the people you serve. (And if you're
  aware of additional resources you'd like included, please pass that information along!)

Please remember that I and the county are here as a resource for you! I can assist with interpretation of MDH and CDC guidelines and recommendations, provide tailored educational information, and help with decision-making as you respond to COVID 19. I will continue to contact you at a minimum of once per week to provide the latest updates, and am always available to answer questions.
