# OFFICIAL PROCEEDINGS OF THE MEETING OF THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF THE COUNTY OF ST. LOUIS, MINNESOTA, HELD ON JANUARY 25, 2022

The Board of County Commissioners of the County of St. Louis, Minnesota, met this 25<sup>th</sup> day of January 2022, at 9:31 a.m., at the Hermantown City Hall, Hermantown, Minnesota, with the following members present: Commissioners Frank Jewell, Patrick Boyle, Ashley Grimm, Keith Musolf, Keith Nelson and Chair Paul McDonald - 6. Absent: Commissioner Mike Jugovich - 1.

Chair McDonald asked for a moment of silence in remembrance of all victims of violence, foreign and domestic; followed by the pledge of allegiance.

Chair McDonald commented that the Board proclaims the week of January 24-31, 2022, as Frontline Workers Appreciation Week in St. Louis County, Minnesota. The proclamation coincides with "Project Blue Light" organized by Arrowhead Regional Public Health and Tribal Health Departments and shows support for all frontline workers. Commissioner Boyle read the proclamation and noted that over the last two weeks 1% of the county has been infected by COVID-19. St. Louis County Public Health Director Amy Westbrook commented that Aubrie Hoover, Senior Public Health Educator & School Specialist, has played a critical role in supporting and educating schools throughout the pandemic. Last week, St. Louis County schools reported 851 new cases of COVID-19 infections.

City of Hermantown Mayor Wayne Boucher welcomed the Board to Hermantown and thanked the Board for their partnership on various city projects.

Chair McDonald opened the meeting to persons who wish to address the Board concerning issues not on the agenda. Randy Poynter, of Canyon, discussed various issues regarding a neighbor who he claims has encroached on his property and asked for county assistance in resolving the issue.

Commissioner Boyle, supported by Commissioner Jewell, moved to approve the consent agenda. The motion passed; six yeas, zero nays, one absent (Jugovich).

Commissioner Nelson, supported by Commissioner Boyle, moved that the Board approves the disbursement of scholarship funds for the 2022-2023 school year as follows: Minnesota North College Mesabi Range Foundation: \$37,500; Minnesota North College Hibbing Foundation: \$37,500; Minnesota North College Vermilion Foundation: \$37,500; and Lake Superior College Foundation: \$37,500; and further, approves the renaming of the scholarship program as recommended by the special committee and the St. Louis County Board of Commissioners as the Tom Rukavina Mineral Royalties Scholarship. Commissioner Jewell requested that the question be divided; the disbursement of funds and renaming of the scholarship program were considered separately. County Attorney Kim Maki noted that in some situations a vote must be taken to divide the question; however, in this situation a vote is not required. After further Commissioner discussion, the motion to approve disbursement of the scholarship funds passed; six yeas, zero nays, on absent (Jugovich). Resolution No. 22-81.

Commissioner Nelson, supported by Commissioner Boyle moved to approve the renaming of the scholarship program as recommended by the special committee and the St. Louis County Board of Commissioners as the Tom Rukavina Mineral Royalties Scholarship. Commissioner Jewell

commented that he asked that the question be divided because he is concerned about the process that St. Louis County uses to name things. Commissioner Jewell noted that things are exclusively named after men and said that there should be a more formal process. After further discussion, the motion passed; five yeas, one nay (Jewell), one absent (Jugovich). Resolution No. 22-81.
