Match Funds Requirement	No matching funds are required. Grant funds must be paid back if eligibility requirements are not met or if proper documentation is not provided upon request.

Eligible Use of Funds	<ol> <li>Must be COVID-19 related, including but not limited to the following:</li> <li>Direct COVID-19 expenditures with receipts, including:         <ul> <li>✓ Personal Protective Equipment (PPE).</li> <li>✓ Cleaning supplies, hand sanitizers, social distancing expenditures, COVID-19 screening equipment, etc.</li> <li>✓ Similar direct expenditures due to COVID-19.</li> </ul> </li> <li>Expenses incurred during or as a result of business interruption due to a mandated Minnesota Governor Executive Order shutdown or COVID-19 related business closing, including but not limited to:         <ul> <li>✓ Rent, mortgage, and utilities (up to 50% are grant eligible)</li> <li>✓ Irrecoverable expenses incurred in the loss of business, contracts, events, bookings, cancellations, etc. (not loss of revenue). Eligible Businesses	Businesses must meet <u>all</u> of the following criteria to be eligible:  ✓ Must physically operate in St. Louis County, Minnesota  ✓ Must currently have 100 or fewer employees (full and part-time combined)  ✓ Must have been open for business prior to March 1, 2020, <i>and</i> on the date of application  ✓ Must be current on property taxes as of July 15, 2020, if applicable  ✓ All types of businesses and non-profits may apply if they meet all other Phase 2  St. Louis County Small Business COVID-19 Relief Grant guidelines						
Ineligible Businesses	Certain businesses are ineligible, including:  ✓ Corporate chains not locally owned  ✓ Businesses that primarily derive income from gambling or adult entertainment  ✓ Businesses that derive income from passive investments or lobbying  ✓ Businesses not compliant with a permit or license requirement  ✓ Businesses that have filed for bankruptcy in 2020  ✓ Any business debarred from doing business with the federal government						



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	Applicants will be required to submit the following information upon request (you are encouraged to attach, email or upload them with the application):		
Application Documentation	<ol> <li>Copies of receipts documenting each direct COVID-19 related business expense.</li> <li>Documentation of expenses related to business interruption during Minnesota's Stay-at-Home Executive Orders* or COVID-related business closing:         <ul> <li>a. Rent, mortgage, and utilities paid (up to 50% are grant eligible); and</li> <li>b. Irrecoverable expenses incurred in the loss of business, contracts, events, bookings, cancellations, etc. (not loss of revenue).</li> </ul> </li> <li>Documentation to show the number of employees (i.e., payroll reports, state or federal payroll-related filing, or other official business payroll documentation).</li> <li>Documentation to show payroll expenses incurred during Minnesota's Stay-at-Home Executive Orders* or COVID-related business closing.</li> <li>Any additional documentation or information deemed necessary by St. Louis County to determine eligibility, disburse funds, or meet program reporting requirements.</li> <li>Failure to submit required documentation upon request will nullify the grant.         <ul> <li>Any or all grant funds received will need to be returned to St. Louis County.</li> </ul> </li> </ol>

Restaurants, food courts, cafes, coffeehouses, and other places of public accommodation offering food or beverage for on-premises consumption, excluding institutional or in-house food cafeterias that serve residents, employees, and clients of businesses, child care facilities, hospitals, and long-term care facilities.</li> <li>b. Bars, taverns, brew pubs, breweries, microbreweries, distilleries, wineries, tasting rooms, clubs, and other places of public accommodation offering alcoholic beverages for on-premises consumption.</li> <li>c. Hookah bars, cigar bars, and vaping lounges offering their products for on premise consumption.</li> <li>d. Theaters, cinemas, indoor and outdoor performance venues, and museums.</li> <li>e. Gymnasiums, fitness centers, recreation centers, indoor sports facilities, indoor exercise facilities, exercise studios, and spas tanning establishments, body art establishments, tattoo parlors, piercing parlors, businesses offering massage therapy or similar body work, spas, salons, nail salons, cosmetology salons, esthetician salons, advanced practice esthetician salons, eyelash salons, and barber shops. This includes, but is not limited to, all salons and shops licensed by the Minnesota Board of Cosmetologist Examiners and the Minnesota Board of Barber Examiners.</li> <li>f. 20-20	March 26, 2020	May 17, 2020	Stay at home order. <b>Open:</b> Retail for curbside only, restaurants and bars deliver and take out only, child care, places of worship for funerals and weddings with 10 or fewer people. <b>Closed:</b> personal services, gyms, personal fitness and yoga studios, martial arts, indoor and outdoor events and entertainment, campgrounds and carter boats, and pools. (Extended 20-33 & 20-48)
20-38	April 17	n/a	Allowing for Safe Outdoor Recreation – opening golf courses; off-highway vehicles, snowmobiles, and watercraft repair shops, sales facilities, and showrooms by appointment only; lake service providers to install, repair, and remove docks, boatlifts, and other water related equipment or deliver boats; bait shops; outdoor shooting ranges and game farms.

20-63	June 2, 2020	June 9, 2020	Re-Open Phase 2. <b>Open:</b> Retail for 50% capacity only, restaurants and bars outdoor dining only not to exceed 50 customers, child care, places of worship for funerals and weddings 25% capacity with 250 or fewer people, outdoor events and entertainment drive-in events only, personal services 25% capacity, campgrounds and charter boats with guidance, pools for organized youth sports and programs. <b>Closed:</b> gyms, personal fitness and yoga studios, martial arts, indoor events and entertainment.
20-74	June 10, 2020		Re-Open Phase 3. <b>Open:</b> Retail for 50% capacity only, restaurants and bars indoor and outdoor dining 50% capacity and not to exceed 250 customers, child care, places of worship for funerals and weddings 25% capacity with 250 or fewer people, outdoor events and entertainment drive-in events only, indoor events and entertainment for 25% capacity not to exceed 250 individuals, personal services 50% capacity, campgrounds and charter boats with guidance, pools 50% capacity, gyms, personal fitness and yoga studios, martial arts for 25% capacity not to exceed 250 customers. <b>Closed:</b> 0
