Convened: Chair Jugovich called the meeting to order at 10:33 a.m.

Commissioners Frank Jewell, Patrick Boyle, and Ashley Grimm participated by WebEx.

At 10:34 a.m., the Committee convened in a closed session for the purpose of discussing the proposed settlement and litigation strategy relating to *King v. County of St. Louis*, Case No. 69DU-CV-17-529, in accordance with Minn. Stat. § 13D.05, Subd. 3(b). At 12:05 p.m., the closed session concluded.

At 12:14 p.m., the Committee of the Whole meeting convened with all members present.

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#### **Public Works & Transportation Committee**

Jugovich/Nelson moved to award a bid to KGM Contractors, Inc., Angora, MN, in the amount of \$2,222,690.15 for project CP 0131-469719 (Low), SAP 069-731-003; CP 0137-275617 (Tied), SAP 069-737-002; CP 0708-275608 (Tied), Bituminous Reclamation, located on CSAH 131 from TH 53 to CSAH 68 in the City of Mountain Iron, CSAH 137 from TH 37 to TH 169 in the City of Mountain Iron, and CR 708 from TH 169 to CR 661 in Great Scott Township. [21-46]. A roll call vote was taken; the motion passed. (7-0)

McDonald/Nelson moved to award a bid to Northland Constructors of Duluth, Inc., Duluth, MN, in the amount of \$854,000.00 for project CP 0059-366241; SAP 069-659-003, located on CSAH 59 0.2 miles North of CR 542 [21-47]. A roll call vote was taken; the motion passed. (7-0)

McDonald/Nelson moved to authorize the purchase of "Base One" material for the 2021 Capital Improvement Program from Team Lab Chemical Corporation of Detroit Lakes, MN, for \$247,500.00. [21-48]. A roll call vote was taken; the motion passed. (7-0)

McDonald/Jugovich moved to authorize the purchase order for the installation of ten (10) Dump Bodies with Hydraulic Systems and Snow Removal Equipment from Towmaster, Inc., of Litchfield, MN, for \$1,522,980.00. [21-49]. Commissioner Nelson asked that sales tax be broken out and requested that the resolution be moved without recommendation; Commissioners McDonald and Jugovich agreed with the request. A roll call vote was taken; the motion passed without recommendation. (7-0)

#### **Finance & Budget Committee**

Nelson/Jugovich moved to authorize the IT Department to purchase two (2) Pure Storage Area Network devices including hardware, software, professional services, and maintenance from Insight Public Sector, Inc. under MN State Contract (Contract Number MNWNC-125//101417) for an estimated fee of \$276,607.44. [21-50]. Information Technology Director Jeremy Craker said that the new devices will have increased efficiency, which is required to support the number of GIS applications across the county. After further discussion, a roll call vote was taken; the motion passed. (7-0)

#### **Central Management & Intergovernmental Committee**

Jewell/Jugovich moved to appoint Garrison Hale to the Arrowhead Library System Board of Directors for a three (3) year term expiring on December 31, 2023. [20-51]. A roll call vote was taken; the amended motion passed. (7-0)

Jewell/Musolf moved to reappoint Doug Hoffbauer to the St. Louis County Cooperative Extension Committee for a three-year term ending December 31, 2023. [20-52]. A roll call vote was taken; the amended motion passed. (7-0)

Nelson/Jugovich moved that the St. Louis County Board opposes state or federal legislation which places a moratorium on issuing permits for nonferrous mining operations or withdrawal of lands from future exploration and potential development in Northeastern Minnesota; and that a copy of this resolution be sent to federal and state legislators to demonstrate the County Board's continued support of state and federal environmental review and permitting standards for the continued exploration and development of all ferrous and nonferrous mining operations in Minnesota. [20-53]. Commissioner Jewell discussed multiple resolutions of support that he felt the Board should consider in future meetings. Commissioner Grimm requested a point of order and asked if the resolutions Commissioner Jewell discussed were an amendment to the initial motion or future discussion items. Commissioner Jewell clarified that the resolutions of support were for future consideration over the next eleven months. Commissioner Jewell asked if there were citizens that would like to address the Board. Caleb Rouse-Zittler, of Babbitt, spoke in opposition of the resolution and stated that it would be irresponsible to harm the wilderness. Jessica Polachick, of Babbitt (currently residing in Pennsylvania), said that she opposes unsafe mining because of the lasting effects to the area. Ms. Polachick said that more than fifty-five science and economic studies document significant harm to the Boundary Waters Canoe Area Wilderness and the Superior National Forest if copper nickel mining were to occur in the headwaters of the Boundary Waters. Benjamin Stagg, of Duluth, spoke in opposition of copper nickel mining; by approving the resolution the county would send a message that it opposes "prove it first" mining. Levi Greg, of Duluth, spoke in opposition of the resolution and felt the resolution opposed "prove it first" mining. Josiah Robert, of Duluth, commented that he opposed the resolution and felt mining operations should be well vetted before opening to ensure operations are safe. Chair Jugovich commented that state legislation instituting a moratorium on nonferrous mining is important to the area, because approval of the legislation would effectively shut down the projects. Commissioner Nelson read portions of a resolution that the Board passed in 2011 in support of the existing open, transparent and comprehensive environmental review and permitting process for nonferrous mining in Northeastern Minnesota. Currently, a mine has made it through the permitting process and NEPA process; if state legislation were passed, it would be unfair that existing projects that have met requirements would pause. A Point of Personal Privilege was requested at 1:09 p.m. At 1:19 p.m., the Board reconvened with all members present. Commissioner Nelson encouraged the Board to review Senate File 59 and commented that once the permitting requirements have been met, the permit should be issued. Commissioner Grimm stated that it was concerning that copper nickel mining has never been done safely in the United States and commented on labor concerns relating to copper nickel mining. Commissioner Musolf commented that this legislation affects all communities, not just the Iron Range. Commissioner McDonald said that Minnesota has a science-based environmental review and permitting process and encouraged people to let the permitting process take place. After further discussion, a roll call vote was taken; the motion passed. (4-3 Jewell, Boyle, Grimm)

#### COMMISSIONER DISCUSSION ITEMS AND REPORTS

Commissioner Nelson noted the recent passing of Carol Begich, wife of former State Representative Joe Begich. Commissioner Nelson commented that the Begich's were champions for the Iron Range.

Commissioner Jewell said that the list of resolutions he discussed earlier were important to the citizens of St. Louis County; he plans to bring the resolutions forward for Board consideration.

At 1:45 p.m., Musolf/Nelson moved to adjourn the Committee of the Whole meeting. A roll call vote was taken; the motion passed. (7-0)

#### **RELATED DEPARTMENT GOAL:**

To provide a safe, well maintained road and bridge system.

#### **ACTION REQUESTED:**

The St. Louis County Board is requested to authorize an agreement with the City of Duluth for the construction of various projects in the Woodland Avenue / Glenwood Street area in 2022.

#### **BACKGROUND:**

There are several construction projects proposed to be wrapped into an agreement with the City of Duluth. Those projects include the following:

- The St. Louis County Public Works Department and the City of Duluth have a
  joint project to construct a roundabout at the intersection of Glenwood
  Street/Snively Road/ Jean Duluth Road in 2022 known as (CP 0037-382899/SP
  069-637-025/SP 118-162-016/SP 118-163-004).
- The Public Works Department and the City of Duluth have a joint project to replace the traffic signals and perform intersection improvements at the intersection of Woodland Avenue/Arrowhead Road and Woodland Avenue/Snively Road in 2022 known as CP 0009- 382898/SP 069-609-047, CP 0037-466143/SP 069-637-026/SP 118-157-023.
- The City of Duluth has a mill and overlay project on Arrowhead Road between Dodge Street and Woodland Avenue in 2022 known as CP 0000-464162/SP 118-160-024. This project will be bid and constructed with the roundabout and intersection improvement projects.

It is justified and mutually beneficial to construct these joint projects and to combine the County and Duluth projects to mutually benefit from economies of scale, mobilization, and contract administration and an agreement needs to be authorized to deliver the project to completion. The Duluth construction will be done under the above project by means of non-participating items in the construction plan.

#### **RECOMMENDATION:**

It is recommended the St. Louis County Board authorize an agreement with the City of Duluth outlining responsibilities of both St. Louis County and the City of Duluth for the construction of the roundabout on Glenwood Street/Snively Road/Jean Duluth Road (CP 0037-382899/SP 069-637-025/SP 118-162-016/SP 118-163-004), intersection improvements at the intersection of Woodland Avenue and Arrowhead Road and Woodland Avenue and Snively Road CP 0009- 382898/SP 069-609-047, CP 0037-466143/SP 069-637-026/SP 118-157-023, and the mill and overlay of Arrowhead Road between Dodge Street and Woodland Avenue CP 0000-464162/SP 118-160-024. #### **ACTION REQUESTED:**

The St. Louis County Board is requested to authorize a cooperative agreement with the Minnesota Department of Transportation (MnDOT) and Wisconsin Central, Ltd. to install gates and signals at the railroad crossing DOT 251911V located on County Road (CR) 880 (Leiste Road) in Solway Township. This project is further identified as SP 069-00206, CP 0880-457961.

#### **BACKGROUND:**

The MnDOT administers the Highway Grade Crossing Safety Improvement Program which provides funding to improve the safety of at-grade railroad crossings. MnDOT provides an annual solicitation for local agencies and railroad companies to submit funding requests to this program. The Public Works Department submitted a request in 2018 for railroad crossing DOT 251911V to install gates and signals. This railroad crossing is currently controlled by STOP signs. MnDOT awarded funding to this requested project for the year 2021.

The total estimated cost of this project is \$496,890.00. The Federal share of this project is 90 percent or \$447,201.00. The local share (St. Louis County local funds) of this project is 10 percent or \$49,689.00. The project is managed by MnDOT and the actual work is performed by the railroad company (Wisconsin Central, Ltd.).

#### **RECOMMENDATION:**

It is recommended that the St. Louis County Board authorize a cooperative agreement with the Minnesota Department of Transportation and Wisconsin Central, Ltd. to install gates and signals at the railroad crossing DOT 251911V located on CR 880 (Leiste Road) in Solway Township. County funds are payable from Fund 200, Agency 203607, Object 652800.



#### **BACKGROUND:**

The City of Brookston recently applied to the State of Minnesota for an LCCMR grant and has received support and a recommendation approving the application as part of the current legislative session. The City is expected to be awarded \$425,000 for a campground, boat launch, and recreation area on the bank of the St. Louis River. The grant approval is contingent on the City finding a fiscal agent for the project.

The City of Brookston has approached St. Louis County and is requesting the County to act as the fiscal agent for the City of Brookston for the 2021 LCCMR grant. The LCCMR grants are reimbursement based and the City of Brookston does not have the financial resources to front the cash or the staff to handle the purchasing and accounting functions associated with this grant.

The Finance Director and Deputy Administrator have reviewed the request. Entering this agreement will result in an increased workload for both staff in the Auditors Finance Office as well as the Purchasing Department. In order for the County's costs to be eligible for reimbursement under this grant the County must time record and bill the City of Brookston for our actual costs. Once this grant is approved the County will begin to

bill the City of Brookston monthly for the costs associated with this grant. The City will then need to approve the expenditure for it to become an eligible reimbursement under this grant.

#### **RECOMMENDATION:**

#### **ACTION REQUESTED:**

The St. Louis County Board is requested to authorize the Sourcewell purchase of one John Deere Model 644LH Wheel Loader from McCoy Equipment of Duluth, Minnesota.

#### **BACKGROUND:**

The St. Louis County Public Works Department's 2021 budget includes the purchase of one wheel loader. It is recommended that the Public Works Department purchase this unit from McCoy Equipment, utilizing the Sourcewell discount contract. This purchase will allow the Public Works Department the proper number of dependable machines to perform maintenance operations at recommended levels.

The Public Works Department is committed to environmental stewardship when making fleet decisions and the planned purchase is environmentally friendly without compromising level of service. This John Deere loader will be the department's first piece of equipment that is a diesel electric hybrid. The machine will burn 25% less fuel which will result in reduced greenhouse gas emissions. The hybrid design produces less noise than traditional equipment which makes it better suited for urban locations. The hybrid has less moving parts, saving on maintenance costs. The 644LH will perform an estimated 30% better than a traditional 644L diesel loader, due to increases in torque, hydraulic performance, and breaking speed. The 644LH was 11% more in cost compared to a traditional 644L. However, this cost increase was justified by the estimated 30% performance increases, and 25% fuel savings over the life of the asset.

The wheel loader will be purchased from McCoy Equipment of Duluth, Minnesota, at a cost of \$286,000.00, the cost of which is within that budgeted for this purpose.

### **RECOMMENDATION:**

It is recommended that the St. Louis County Board authorize the purchase of one John Deere Model 644LH Loader from McCoy Equipment of Duluth, Minnesota, at the Sourcewell Contract price of \$286,000.00, payable from Fund 407, Agency 407001, and Object 666400.

#### **RELATED DEPARTMENT GOAL:**

To secure and administer federal, state and other funding which implement county policies and maximize local resources.

#### **ACTION REQUESTED:**

The St. Louis County Board is requested to award 2021 Aquatic Invasive Species (AIS) Prevention Aid and authorize the Planning and Community Development Director and a representative of the County Attorney to negotiate contracts and authorize the appropriate county officials to execute contracts for all approved projects.

#### **BACKGROUND INFORMATION:**

In the 2014 legislative session, the Aquatic Invasive Species Prevention Aid program was established. The funds under this program are allocated to counties based 50 percent on each county's share of watercraft trailer launches and 50 percent on county's share of watercraft trailer parking spaces. The state appropriation for 2021 is \$10 million. St. Louis County's allocation for 2021 is \$709,530. One half of the allocation is paid to the county in July 2021 and the second half is paid in December 2021. There is also an additional \$20,000 available in reprogrammed funds, which are un-utilized 2019 grant funds.

The program funds are to be used to prevent the introduction or limit the spread of aquatic invasive species at access sites throughout the county. In May 2015, Resolution No. 15-284, the County Board approved the Aquatic Invasive Species Prevention Plan and authorized the Planning and Community Development Director to solicit proposals for the use of Aquatic Invasive Species Prevention Aid. To date, St. Louis County has funded 53 projects totaling \$3,774,396.

On September 24, 2020, notification was provided to all cities, towns and over 400 parties informing them that the county was soliciting proposals for the use of the 2021 Aquatic Invasive Species Prevention Aid. The application, instructions and other information were posted on the St. Louis County AIS webpage and distributed using a GovDelivery newsletter. Proposals were due by November 20, 2020.

The County has received 9 applications totaling \$853,445 for a variety of proposals. Based on the technical review and other considerations, county staff has made specific funding recommendations in the amount of \$654,530 for eight projects.

#### **RECOMMENDATION:**

It is recommended that the St. Louis County Board allocate the 2021 Aquatic Invasive Species Prevention Aid as outlined in County Board File No. \_\_\_\_\_; authorize the Planning and Community Development Director and a representative of the County Attorney to negotiate and execute contracts; and authorize the appropriate county officials to execute contracts for all approved projects. Funds for these projects are available from Fund 100, Agency 10999, and Grant 10910, for Year 2021.
