INCIDENT SUMMARY:

St. Louis County Sheriff Office was dispatched to Chester Park Dr and 8th Street for a report of a found body floating in the water. The victim, deceased, was recovered after being found in the Chester Creek in Duluth, MN. The victim has been identified as Kyle Noble, a 22 year old male from Baudette, MN and a student at the University of Duluth. The incident does not appear to be suspicious at this time. The incident remains under investigation by the St. Louis county Sheriff's Office.

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION OR UPDATE:

On 10-31-2015 at approximately 1314 hours the St. Louis County Sheriff Office received information that there was a body floating in the water just near of 8th St. and Chester Park Dr in the Chester Creek. The Body was recovered and later identified as Kyle Michael Noble from Baudette, MN. Kyle is a 22 year old male who is a student at the University of Duluth.

Throughout the investigation of the incident, the St. Louis County Sheriff Office learned that Kyle was last seen by a family member at approximately 0200 on 10-31-2015. Kyle left family member house at approximately 0200 hours and was walking the trails along Chester Creek to return to his residence. While walking the trails along Chester Creek, it appears Kyle slipped on the trail, causing him to fall approximately 75 feet into the Chester creek. St. Louis County Sheriff Office is awaiting the Medical Examiners report, although there does not appear to be any foul play, alcohol was a factor and apparent death being accidental due to the fall and head trauma observe when Kyle was recovered from the water.
