Justice for Families Program Grant Application

WHEREAS, St. Louis County Public Health & Human Services Department (PHHS) is the lead applicant of a collaboration between PHHS and the Domestic Abuse Intervention Programs, Duluth Family Visitation Center, Program for Aid to Victims of Sexual Assault, Arrowhead Regional Corrections Probation Office, County Attorney's Office, Public Defender's Office, and the Sixth Judicial District of Minnesota; and

WHEREAS, The Justice for Families Program Grant replaces the former Office on Violence Against Women Safe Havens Supervised Visitation and Safe Exchange grant program, for which St. Louis County has been the fiscal agent for six years; and

WHEREAS, This new Justice for Families Program grant was authorized in the Violence Against Women Reauthorization Act (VAWA) of 2013 to improve the response of all aspects of the civil and criminal justice system to families with a history of domestic violence, dating violence, sexual assault, and stalking, or in cases involving allegations of child sexual abuse; and

WHEREAS, The Justice for Families Program grant supports improving the capacity of communities and courts to respond to families affected by the four aforementioned crimes through supervised visitation and safe exchange by and between parents; training and technical assistance for people who work with families in the court system; civil legal services; provision of resources in juvenile court matters; and development or promotion of legislation, model codes, policies, and best practices;

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, That the St. Louis County Board authorizes the Public Health and Human Services Department to submit a grant application in an amount up to \$600,000 for a Justice for Families Program Grant from the U.S. Department of Justice Office on Violence Against Women for the 36-month grant funding period of October 1, 2016 - September 30, 2019;
