

**OFFICIAL PROCEEDINGS OF THE MEETING  
OF THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS  
OF THE COUNTY OF ST. LOUIS, MINNESOTA,  
HELD ON MAY 3, 2016**

The Board of County Commissioners of the County of St. Louis, Minnesota, met this 3<sup>rd</sup> day of May 2016, at 9:38 a.m., at the St. Louis County Courthouse, Duluth, Minnesota, with the following members present: Commissioners Frank Jewell, Patrick Boyle, Chris Dahlberg, Tom Rukavina, Pete Stauber, Keith Nelson, and Chair Steve Raukar - 7. Absent: None - 0.

Chair Raukar asked for a moment of silence to honor U.S. troops, their families, and for all innocent victims of war and conflict, and asked that everyone pray that mankind comes to the realization that our commonalities far outweigh our differences on a global scale, followed by the pledge of allegiance.

Sheriff Ross Litman offered his "Words of Wisdom" by reading quotes from Mahatma Gandhi, Albert Schweitzer, Theodore Roosevelt, and Tom Brokaw. (Board File No. 60292)

The Board recognized the Embedded St. Louis County Social Worker in the Duluth Police Department Program, a partnership between St. Louis County and the City of Duluth. The Minnesota Chiefs of Police Association recently honored the pilot program with the "Excellence in Innovation Award". Gena Bossart, of St. Louis County Adult Services, thanked the Board for their continued support. Ona Filipovich, of St. Louis County Health & Human Services, and Lt. Chad Nygorksi, of the Duluth Police Department, discussed the success of the program. City of Duluth Mayor Emily Larson expressed appreciation of the partnership between the City of Duluth and St. Louis County.

The U.S. Forest Service presented the St. Louis County Rescue Squad with the "Enduring Service Award". Forest District Ranger Gus Smith said this was the only award in a twenty-state region. Kurt Erickson, of the St. Louis County Rescue Squad, thanked the Board, Sheriff Ross Litman, Undersheriff Dave Phillips, and St. Louis County Rescue Squad Capt. Rick Slatten for their continued support. Undersheriff Phillips said that all members of the Rescue Squad are volunteers and the squad averages between 20,000 and 25,000 volunteer hours per year.

Chair Raukar then opened the meeting to persons who wanted to address the Board concerning issues not on the agenda. Dr. Jonathan Trexel, Executive Director of Northern Life Ranch, Lincoln, NE, discussed the mission of Northern Life Ranch and said that they plan to be operational in St. Louis County in the year 2017. The Northern Life Ranch is one of seven ranches in the United States.

Commissioner Nelson, supported by Commissioner Dahlberg, moved to approve the consent agenda. The motion passed; seven yeas, zero nays.
