

**OFFICIAL PROCEEDINGS OF THE MEETING
OF THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS
OF THE COUNTY OF ST. LOUIS, MINNESOTA,
HELD ON JUNE 28, 2016**

The Board of County Commissioners of the County of St. Louis, Minnesota, met this 28th day of June 2016, at 9:33 a.m., at the Pike Town Hall, Embarrass, Minnesota, with the following members present: Commissioners Frank Jewell, Patrick Boyle, Chris Dahlberg, Tom Rukavina, Pete Stauber, Keith Nelson, and Chair Steve Raukar - 7. Absent: None - 0.

Chair Raukar asked for a moment of silence to honor U.S. troops, their families, and for all innocent victims of war and conflict, and asked that everyone pray that mankind comes to the realization that our commonalities far outweigh our differences on a global scale, followed by the pledge of allegiance.

Commissioner Nelson offered his “Words of Wisdom” by reading a poem titled “The Veteran’s – Lest We Forget!”

Chair Raukar then opened the meeting to persons who wanted to address the Board concerning issues not on the agenda. Harold Langowski, Pike Township Chair, welcomed the Board to Pike Township. Rod Honkola, of Embarrass, discussed the placement of chevron road safety lights near his property and asked the Board to consider removing the lights. Scott Dane, of the Associated Contract Loggers and Truckers, discussed the pine pulpwood market and asked that the Board review future permits to make pine pulpwood optional. Mr. Dane indicated that the Associated Contract Loggers and Truckers support the new paper mill in Aurora and estimates that 35 trucks would be traveling through Aurora on a daily basis. Steve Giorgi, Executive Director of RAMS (Range Association of Municipalities and Schools), discussed the re-establishment of the Range Mayors Association. Mark Skelton, Mayor of Hoyt Lakes, discussed the Louisiana-Pacific project in Hoyt Lakes and thanked the Board for their support. Chuck Novak, Mayor of Ely, touched on copper-nickel mining and said that Ely supports the environmental review process. Steve Herr, of Cook, discussed the Unorganized Road tax and expressed concerns regarding the fairness of the tax. Anita Provinzino, District Administrator of the North St. Louis Soil and Water Conservation District, invited the Board and the public to a watercraft and decontamination demonstration that will be held at the conclusion of today’s Board meeting. Dan Hendrickson, Business Manager - IBEW 294 (International Brotherhood of Electrical Workers – Local 294), discussed a bid award for a solar project at the Virginia motor pool building and was concerned that there would be a recommendation to award the bid to a contractor outside of St. Louis County even though a local contractor submitted a bid. Harold Kibbees, owner of Hometown Electric, asked the Board to consider using a local contractor for installation of the solar panels. Dick Zahn, of Ely, gave the Board an update on the Ely Veteran’s Memorial project and asked to Board to consider match funding.

At 10:23 a.m., a public hearing was conducted pursuant to Resolution No. 16-364, adopted June 7, 2016, to consider the issuance of an off-sale intoxicating liquor license to Hugo’s, Inc., d/b/a Hugo’s, Ault Township. St. Louis County Attorney Mark Rubin gave the initial presentation and submitted a packet for the record that included documentation of required notices, minutes from the Liquor

Licensing Committee meeting, proof of paid property taxes and required documents for the license. Jessica Larsen and Jesse Willemarck appeared on behalf of the establishment. Chair Raukar asked if there were any governmental entities, supporters or opponents, or citizens who wished to speak regarding the proposed action and no one came forth. At 10:29 a.m., Commissioner Nelson, supported by Commissioner Rukavina, moved to close the public hearing. The motion passed; seven yeas, zero nays.

Commissioner Rukavina, supported by Commissioner Jewell, moved to approve granting the off-sale intoxicating liquor license to Hugo's, Inc., d/b/a Hugo's, Ault Township. The motion passed; seven yeas, zero nays. Resolution No. 16-417.

At 10:31 a.m., a public hearing was conducted pursuant to Resolution No. 16-365, adopted June 7, 2016, to consider the issuance of an off-sale intoxicating liquor license to Random ACT Inc. d/b/a Kountry Krossroads, Pike Township. St. Louis County Attorney Mark Rubin gave the initial presentation and submitted a packet for the record that included documentation of required notices, minutes from the Liquor Licensing Committee meeting, proof of paid property taxes and required documents for the license. Cheyenne Ferguson and William Jones appeared on behalf of the establishment. Commissioner Stauber stepped out of the meeting from 10:32 a.m. to 10:34 a.m. Chair Raukar asked if there were any governmental entities, supporters or opponents, or citizens who wished to speak regarding the proposed action and no one came forth. At 10:35 a.m., Commissioner Jewell, supported by Commissioner Rukavina, moved to close the public hearing. The motion passed; seven yeas, zero nays.

Commissioner Rukavina, supported by Commissioner Jewell, moved to approve granting the off-sale intoxicating liquor license to Random ACT Inc. d/b/a Kountry Krossroads, Pike Township. The motion passed; seven yeas, zero nays. Resolution No. 16-418.

Commissioner Rukavina, supported by Commissioner Jewell, moved to approve the consent agenda without Item #12, Contracts authorized with LBC Garage Doors, of Duluth, MN, Quality Garage Door Service, of Duluth, MN, and Door Service, Inc., of Superior, WI, for three-year terms beginning July 1, 2016 through June 30, 2019, with two (2) optional one-year extensions, for county-wide overhead door services. [16-264]. Commissioner Dahlberg stepped out of the meeting at 10:39 a.m. The motion passed; six yeas, zero nays, one absent (Dahlberg).

Commissioner Dahlberg returned to the meeting at 10:41 a.m.

Commissioner Nelson, supported by Commissioner Boyle, moved to consider an award of bid for the reconstruction of County State Aid Highway 9/4th Street in Duluth; the item has not been to Committee of the Whole. The motion passed; seven yeas, zero nays.

Commissioner Boyle, supported by Commissioner Jewell, moved to award a bid to KGM Contractors, Inc., of Angora, MN, in the amount of \$13,787,141.74 for project CP 0009-147349 TST, SP 69-609-040, Grading, Storm Sewer, Watermain, Sanitary Sewer, Aggregate Base, Curb and Gutter, Bituminous Surface, Sidewalks, Retaining Walls, Signals, located on CSAH 9 (4th Street and Wallace Avenue) from 6th Avenue East to Arrowhead Road in Duluth, length 2.64 miles, in Duluth.

Commissioner Jewell stepped out of the meeting from 10:55 a.m. to 11:01 a.m. After further discussion, the motion passed; seven yeas, zero nays. Resolution No. 16-419.

Commissioner Rukavina, supported by Commissioner Jewell moved to pass a resolution appointing election judges for unorganized townships with polling places and those voting by mail, designate polling places and authorize appointment of the following boards: Absentee Ballot, Mail Ballot and Uniformed and Overseas Citizen Absentee Voting Act (UOCAVA) ballot. Compensation shall be \$10.50 per hour (not including county staff), plus mileage reimbursement at \$0.54 per mile. Commissioner Dahlberg stepped out of the meeting from 11:08 a.m. to 11:12 a.m. The motion passed; seven yeas, zero nays. Resolution No. 16-420.

Commissioner Nelson, supported by Commissioner Boyle, moved to return the award of bid for County-Wide Overhead Door Service to St. Louis County Administration for further review (Consent Item #12). The motion passed; seven yeas, zero nays.

WHEREAS, The State of Minnesota, Department of Public Safety, Bureau of Criminal Apprehension (BCA) and human service agencies are empowered to create agreements that are necessary to exercise their powers; and

WHEREAS, Under Minn. Stat. § 299C.46, the BCA must provide a criminal justice data communications network to benefit these agencies in Minnesota; and

WHEREAS, The Public Health and Human Services Department (PHHS) is authorized by law to use the criminal justice data communications network; and

WHEREAS, The BCA either maintains repositories of data or has access to repositories of data that benefit PHHS in performing its duties, of which PHHS would like to access in support of its official duties; and

WHEREAS, The purpose of creating this Joint Powers Agreement is to create a method by which PHHS has access to those systems and tools for which it has eligibility, taking into account the requirements and the limitations of obtaining that access;

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, That the St. Louis County Board approves a Joint Powers Agreement with the State of Minnesota, Department of Public Safety, Bureau of Criminal Apprehension (BCA) to use systems and tools available over the state's criminal justice data communications network for which the county is eligible, a copy of which is contained in County Board File No. 60391;

RESOLVED FURTHER, That the appropriate county officials are hereby authorized to sign the State of Minnesota Joint Powers Agreement and any subsequent amendment or agreement that

may be required by the State of Minnesota to maintain the county's connection to the systems and tools offered by the state.
